MONTH AT GLANCE

During the month of August, the Neighborhood Coyote Program continued to document reports and share relevant information to residents who reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods.

This month, the Neighborhood Coyote Program participated at Rosemead's National Night Out event on August 2nd. Residents learned about best practices for living near coyotes, including attractant removal and hazing (shooing away coyotes).

Coyotes are spotted at various times of the day, that is why we have to be extra vigilant about keeping our pets safe. Pets should be supervised at all times especially in areas where coyotes are commonly spotted. Always bring your pet food indoors when pets are done eating and make sure your yard is well lit when pets are released into the yard. When going for walks, make sure your pet is on a leash that is no longer than 6ft and try to keep cats indoors or at least between the dusk and dawn hours.

5	0	Coyote bit or injured a human




REPORT MAP
