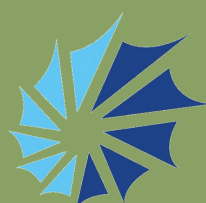

MONTH AT GLANCE

During the month of February, the Neighborhood Coyote Program continued to document reports and share relevant information to residents who reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods. Notably, we met with the City of Rosemead to recap 2020 activities and collaborate on how to better serve residents in 2021. Our coyote social media campaign gained further traction with posts relating to the start of coyote mating season on Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, and NextDoor. In February, our NextDoor posts had 5500 impressions and 15 engagements from our 10 cities, all of which were positive. Lastly, we participated in a Wildlife Watch partners meeting and engaged in a coyote safety webinar hosted by the Pasadena Humane Society.

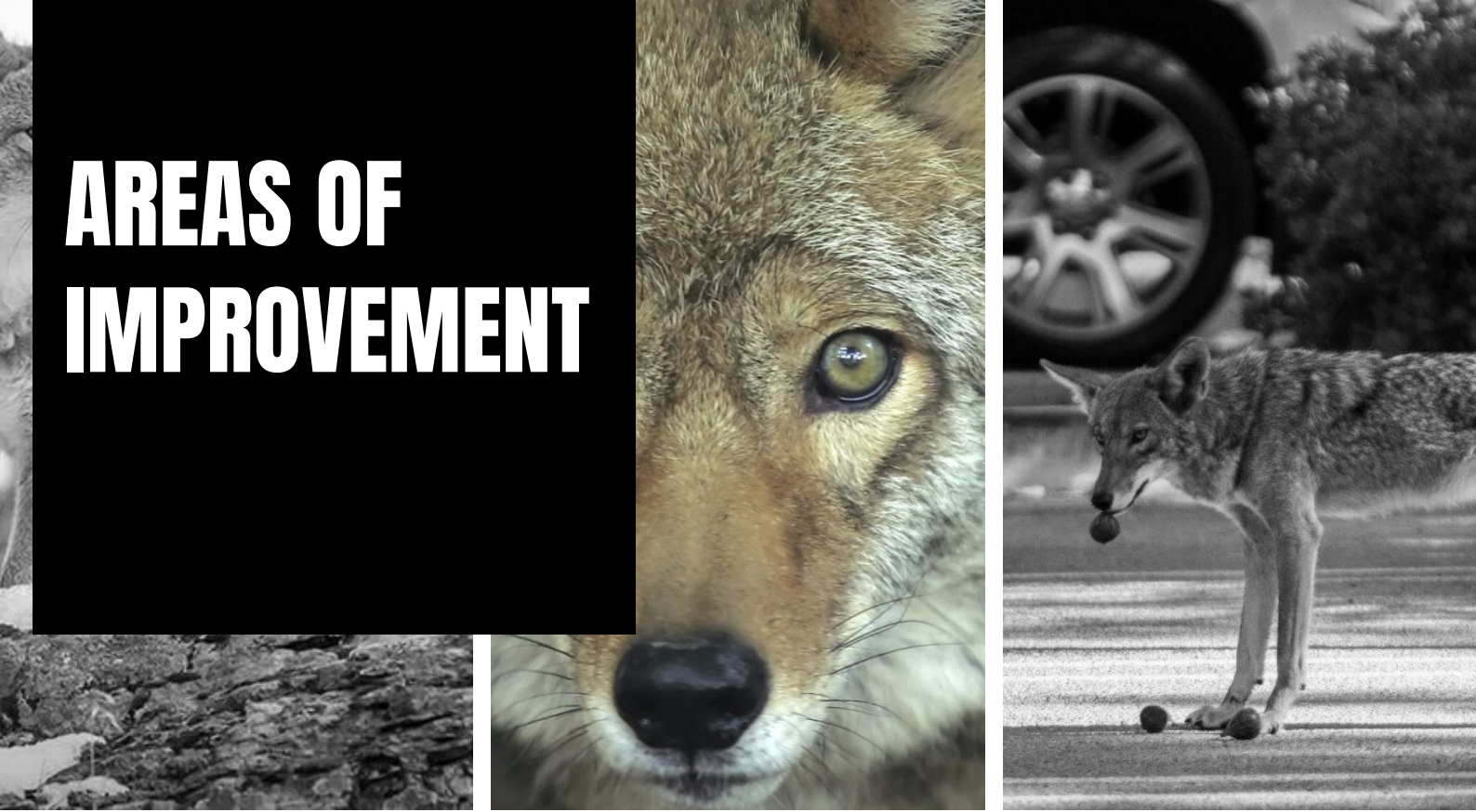
MONTHLY TOTALS AND RESPONSE LEVELS



Within the City of Rosemead, there was 1 report of coyote interactions for the month of February. The report that was made, was classified as Response Level 2. Response Level 2 includes coyotes entering a yard or home with or without pets present. There was at least one coyote seen in the City of Rosemead in the month of February.

AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT



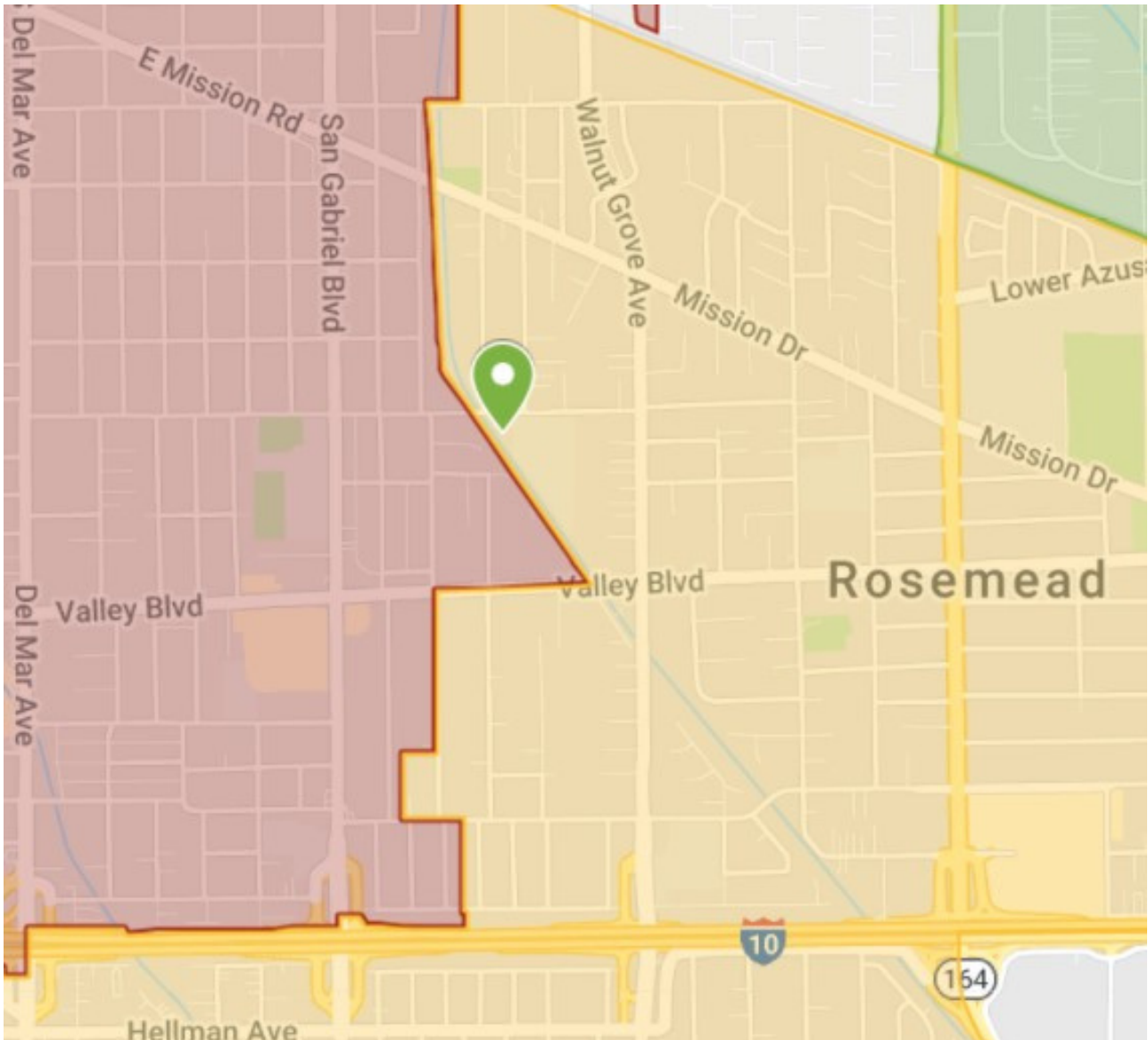
