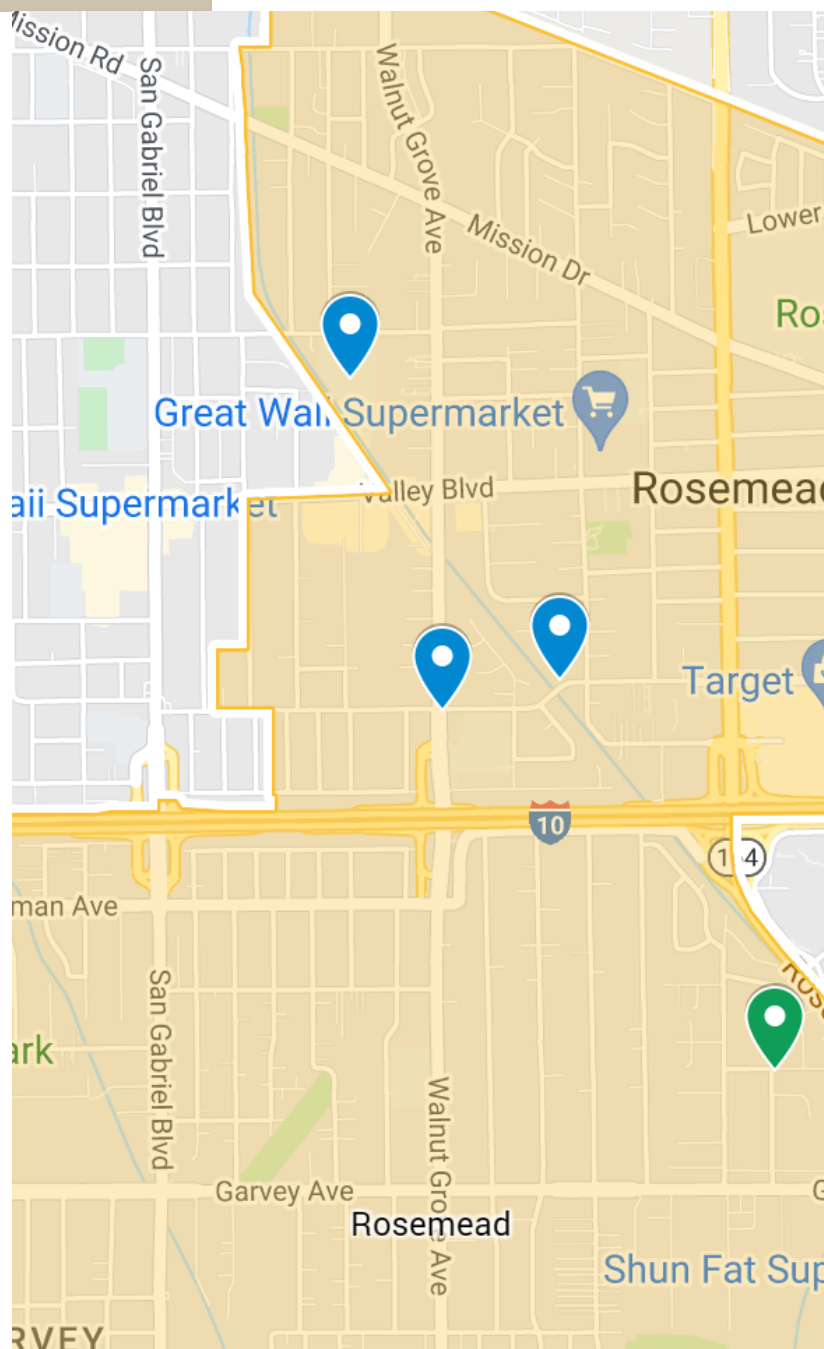

3	0	Coyote entered yard and injured or killed unattended or attended pets; Coyote bit or injured an unattended pet/pet on a leash; Coyote aggressively followed or approached you with your pet
4	0	Coyote aggressively followed or approached you without your pet
5	0	Coyote bit or injured a human
